PUBLIC HEARING RE: 2012 CDBG PROGRAM
AND PRIOR YEAR MODIFICATION

Council President Jason Stains called the public hearing to order at 7:15 p.m. with the following in attendance:

Mr. Stains noted that the hearing was advertised in accordance with rules and regulations of the CDBG Program. The Borough held a public hearing on February 15, 2012 to solicit the views of citizens on the types of projects which should be carried out with the 2012 CDBG Program funds. The Borough anticipates receiving a grant of \$129,111 in FY 2012 CDBG funds. The Borough has determined that the best use of these funds would be for the following activities:

In addition, the Borough is proposing to modify the FY 2009 and 2010 CDBG Programs by moving funds allocated to Downtown Facade and Administration to Street Improvements and Curb Ramps. With these modifications, we will have approximately \$136,000 available for Streets and approximately \$166,000 for Curbs this year. DCED has urged entitlement communities to spend this money as soon as possible.

Present was Karen Parish of Mullin and Lonergan Associates (the Borough's CDBG consults), to explain the program, proposed projects and modifications, and to answer any questions. Handouts were available for distribution to interested parties.

Mr. Hamberger noted that bids will be opened for CDBG streets on 04/24, contract documents will be prepared after that for handicapped curbs; and the monies will be spent by the end of summer.

Hearing no further questions or comments, the hearing closed at 7:25 p.m.
